1. Thanks to all that have paid their 2018 Dues. The remaining members (5) that haven't paid the 2018 dues, will receive a final notice via E-mail. Dues must be paid before January 31st, or you will go on the "dink" list. It is vital that we maintain all current members as the "pool" for potential new members has been slowly decreasing, mostly due to the overall reduction in the Submarine Force. Nationally there are 12,873 members with about 173 Bases. We are barely increasing this count because the new recruitment is offset by those going on EP. Do your part, renew now and keep the organization strong, so that we can continue to support our programs.

2. Of the 90 current Corvina Base members, we have: 33 (37%) in Reno/Sparks Area; 21 (23%) in Carson/ Douglas Area; 10 (11%) in Fernley/Fallon Area; 12 (13%) in California; and 14 (16%) out of state (One of these is on active sub duty). Also, in case this has been keeping you up at night, we have: 15 regular annual members; 61 USSVI life members; 52 Base life members; 49 Holland Club members; 5 associate members; 74 war veteran status members; 82 members with E-mail; 13 (of 32) Base plank owners left; 5 WWII members left; 38 have departed on EP; and 7 honorary Base members. Only about 28 (31%) Base members pay annual dues, which is why the Booster Club is so important.

# **Chaplains Report**



#### Eternal Patrol

Herbert "Doc" L. Starmer: HMC (SS) 5/23/1923 – 5/26/2016

The Corvina Base was sorry to learn that Doc had passed away 18 months ago but we did not know about his passing until a few days ago because his family didn't know about his membership in the Corvina Base. Once we made contact with Doc's son Bill, he was very cooperative with giving the information we needed. Bill said his Dad had been struggling physically for about a year and had been to see his cardiologists, came home and laid down and shortly passed away of a heart attack three days after his 93<sup>rd</sup> birthday. Bill also said his Dad's mind was sharp until the day he died. His body was cremated and the cremains were scattered upon the Pacific Ocean's water.

Doc was born in White Oak, Harrison Co., Missouri and joined the US Navy 8/12/1941 before WWII started and just a few months after his father had died. The name Starmer is an English name and means "famous stone". Doc retired from the navy in 1961 as a Chief Hospital Corpsman having served 20 years on 7 submarines and 1 sub tender and having qualified on the USS Cobia (SS-245) in 1944 it is easy to see that it being the boat that he did war patrols on it was the boat he mostly was connected to and also wrote 2 books about his experiences on the Cobia. Doc was a proud submarine veteran. He had 7 children (5 boys and 2 girls), 14 grandchildren, 15 great grandchildren.

Doc was a member of the WWII Submarine Veterans and in 2008 joined USSVI and the Corvina Base and was Holland Club member. He wrote articles for the Polaris Magazine (WWII Submarine veterans) and Reminisce Magazine plus writing 2 books in his 80's about the Cobia and his experiences being a Hospital Corpsman on submarines. Doc was well known and appreciated by the staff at the Wisconsin Maritime Museum in Manitowoc, Wisconsin where 28 WWII Submarines were built and where the Cobia is part of the museum.

After retiring from the navy Doc worked for the state of California in weights and measures retiring in 1976. The navy ships he served on were the:

USS Cobia (SS-245) USS Capitaine (SS/AGSS-336 USS Remora (SS-487) USS Segundo (SS-398) USS Nereus (AS-17) USS Carp (SS-338) USS Tilefish (SS-307) USS Spinax (SS/SSR/AGSS-489)

#### **Boats Lost in January**

<u>USS S-36 (SS-141)</u> was lost on 20-Jan-1942 when it was destroyed after grounding on Taka Bakang Reef in Makassar Strait, Indonesia, Near Makassar City, the crew were all rescued.

<u>USS S-26 (SS-131)</u> was lost on 24-Jan-1942 with the loss of 46 crew when it was sunk after ramming by USS PC-460 in the Gulf of Panama, 14 miles west of San Jose Light.

**USS Argonaut** (SS166) was lost on **10-Jan-1943** with the loss of **105 crew** when it was sunk off Rabaul **USS Swordfish** (SS-193) was lost on or after **12-Jan-1945** with the loss of **90 crew** when it was sunk near Yaku Island off Kyushu
